David's Story

David is one of thousands of children who have personally experienced incredible transformation through child sponsorship.

David was born in the Solwezi district in Zambia. When David was a year old, his mother passed away and he was left in the care of his aunt, the elder sister of his late mother. David's aunt informed him that his father left his mother after she became pregnant, which is why he was not in David's life. David had no father figure.

David never went to school as a young child. It was by the grace of God that a man found David on the roadside and enrolled him in the local community school at nine years old.

Three years later, David was handed over to his uncle who lived in the Mpongwe district of Zambia. David stopped attending school and was forced to work with his uncle as a fisherman. David's uncle became abusive and would shove David into the deep, crocodile-infested waters of the Kafue River for fish. While David survived these dangerous encounters, he decided to leave his uncle and found himself living on the streets.

David suffered, and almost died, from the beatings he endured living on the street. He moved back to Solwezi, even though he could not afford to attend school. There, David was fortunate to be taken in by a female teacher who cared for him and enrolled him in school. After completing his grade seven exams, he returned to his aunt who introduced him to his grandparents on his father's side.

Upon learning about David's struggles, **his grandparents enrolled him at ZACTS, a school supported by International Needs. David thrived in his new environment and had a renewed outlook on life.** "I really thank God for my transformed life," said David. "I no longer feel like an orphan, and I am looking forward to a better life."


Against All Odds

Coming from the humble and challenging surroundings of the Kibera slum in Kenya, Duncan faced overwhelming odds. As a young boy, he was often sent home from school due to unpaid fees, leaving him with feelings of helplessness. But everything changed when he received sponsorship support.

He vividly remembers the moment when his teacher informed him that his school fees were paid for the entire year.
